






# Seeing Through 2021 Acrylic Painting




Silence 2022 Colored Pencil




Under Curves 2021 Colored Pencil



Almond Man 2022 Colored Pencil




Distortion and Transformation 2023 Colored Pencil

# Mogao Caves #1 2022

#### Chinese Ancient Water Color (on miniature mural)

This is one of a series of artworks with inspirations from an ancient rock cave in Mogao Dunhuang, China, an oasis in the desert through which Buddhism was passed into China from India. In order to understand the ancient mural painting better, I experimented to paint in the same way ancient artists did. It is very time-consuming and complex to draw on a rock-made mural since I can apply only one color once, then wait to apply another after it dries. For ancient mural artists, it can only be harder and more tiring, so they must have done it with absolute sincerity and devotion.
